

Joel A. Kaplan, M.D. currently is at the University of California San Diego Medical Center. Prior to this appointment he served as Chancellor of the Health Sciences Center, Vice President of Health Affairs, Dean of the School of Medicine and Senior Vice Provost for Academic Affairs at the University of Louisville. Dr. Kaplan also worked at New York's Mount Sinai School of Medicine where he was the Horace Goldsmith Professor and Chairman of the Department of Anesthesiology, Senior Vice President for Clinical Affairs and President of Faculty Practice Associates.

Dr. Kaplan is a native New Yorker who grew up in Philadelphia. He received his medical degree from Jefferson Medical College and completed a residency in anesthesiology at the University of Pennsylvania under renowned chair, R. D. Dripps. After serving two years in the U.S. Army Medical Corps, Dr. Kaplan joined the faculty at Emory University in 1974, where he remained until 1983 when he was recruited to Mount Sinai School of Medicine. He became a Diplomate of the American Board of Anesthesiology in 1973, a Diplomate of the American Board of Medical Management in 1996, and was designated as a Certified Physician Executive (CPE) by the American College of Physician Executives in 1997. Dr. Kaplan is a Fellow of the American College of Anesthesiology, the American College of Chest Physicians and the American College of Cardiology. He has served as Editor-in-Chief of the *Journal of Cardiothoracic and Vascular Anesthesia* since 1986, and is past Editor-in-Chief of *Seminars in Cardiothoracic and Vascular Anesthesia* and *Cardiothoracic and Vascular Anesthesia Updates*. He is a prolific writer who has authored or co-authored over 200 manuscripts, textbooks and review articles. Dr. Kaplan is a Past President of the Society of Cardiovascular Anesthesiologists.

Dr. Kaplan has been married to his wife, Norma for 45 years, and they have one daughter, Ellen. Ellen is married to Joe Lovelace and they live in San Jose, California, where she runs her own Concierge Service.
